
Of the 12,500 New Jersey youth in foster care, at least 300 "age out" of the foster-care system every year. Forced to leave the foster-care system at age 18, many become homeless and lack the necessary life-skills to fend for themselves. To make matters worse, emergency and permanent housing services in Gloucester and adjacent counties have been virtually non-existent, leaving these young people unsure how or where to begin to prepare for a positive future.


Geared toward youth between ages 18 and 21, Life Link provides former foster children a safe place to live, and the added support of life-skills training, crisis intervention, counseling and guidance — all of which are instrumental to their transition to independence.

- Age-appropriate, non-intrusive supervision in a nurturing, homelike setting
- Security in knowing they can live in the Life Link Home until they are able to make it on their own

- Meal preparation
- ♦ Staying organized


# OUR MISSION AND COMMITMENT


# LIFE LINK HOME PROVIDES A SAFE, SUPPORTIVE RESIDENTIAL ENVIRONMENT


Housing is a crucial component of the Life Link program. When foster children "age out" of the system, they often do not have the financial resources or the skills to secure meaningful employment to pay for medical care and safe housing.

Life Link is addressing that concern, and plans to construct a two-story residential apartment building large enough to accommodate 10 young persons. Each building will contain 10 efficiency apartments and consist of three wings — which include separate wings for male and female residents and a central apartment for a residential supervisor. All residents will share a living room, kitchen, dining room and laundry facilities.

Robins' Nest hopes to expand the Life Link program as more funding becomes available. With your support, Robins' Nest can forge ahead with plans to build additional facilities to accommodate up to 20 more children who have "aged out" of the foster-care system.
